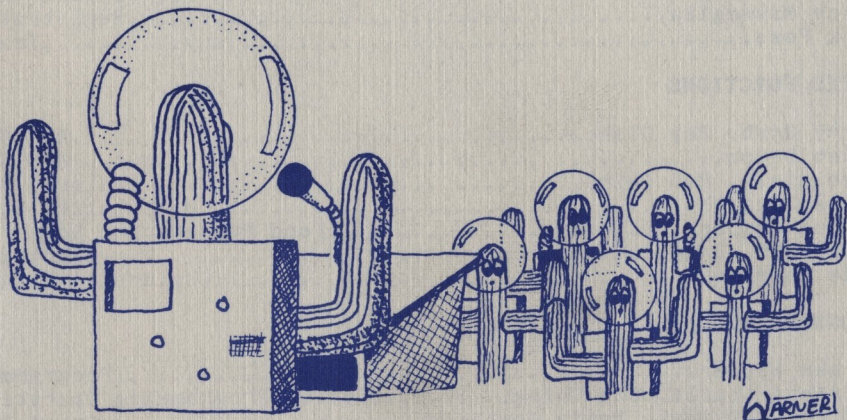

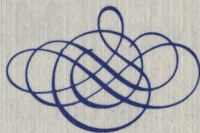

Our Progress Reports will be 5-1/2" wide by 8-1/2" high in format. This Progress Report is going out to most members of the 1984 Los Angeles World Science Fiction Convention, the 1985 Austin North American Science Fiction Convention, the 1986 San Diego WesterCon, the 1985 Tucson World Fantasy Convention, and recent attendees of Arizona SF&F conventions. This is as a courtesy to everyone to give them a chance to get their memberships at the lowest possible rates. Total number published and mailed approximate 10,000 households.

The Dealers' Room will be located in the Civic Plaza, across from our main hotels. It will be open Thursday through Sunday with setup on Thursday morning with first opening to members at 1 pm on Thursday.

We're committed to maintaining a favorable attendee-dealer ratio of at least 20:1 with a present limit of 150 tables. Each dealer is limited to a maximum of 3 tables each.

Rates are presently \$60.00 per table (does not include membership, which is optional - each table includes a pass into the Dealers' Room only). A Progress Report for dealers will be sent out soon to all dealers who presently have tables. We're already over 1/3 sold out and expect to be completely sold out of our present 150 limit by the Atlanta WorldCon.

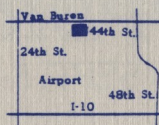

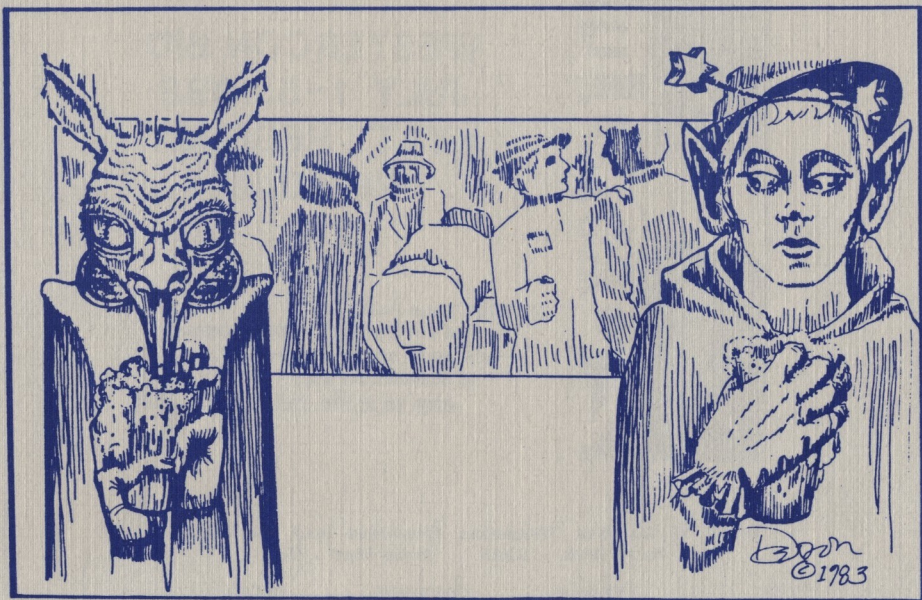
VOLUNTEERS

HOTELS

We have almost 1300 rooms blocked for convention attendees at the four hotels closest to the Civic Plaza. The closest and largest - the Hyatt Regency - is across the street from the main entrance to the Plaza and the furthest is two blocks away. The largest two (the Phoenix Hilton the Hyatt Regency - the headquarters and party hotel) are next door to each other and have almost 1100 of our total rooms.

Room rates are presently confirmed at a not-to-exceed rate of \$65.00 for the highest of the hotel and just over \$40.00 for the cheapest. Reservation cards will go out with Progress Report 3 in March, 1987. We will be using a Housing Bureau, so all reservations will be made through the Bureau and not the Hotels. We have special suite rates, which will be available only through the convention.

WHAT'S A NASFiC?

We were authorized by the World Science Fiction Society's 1985 convention, the Worldcon, in Melbourne, Australia, to conduct a science fiction/fantasy convention called the NASFiC. That stands for North American Science Fiction Convention. Our official name is "CactusCon".

A NASFiC is conducted whenever the WorldCon is held outside of North America. For 1987 the Worldcon's being conducted in England.

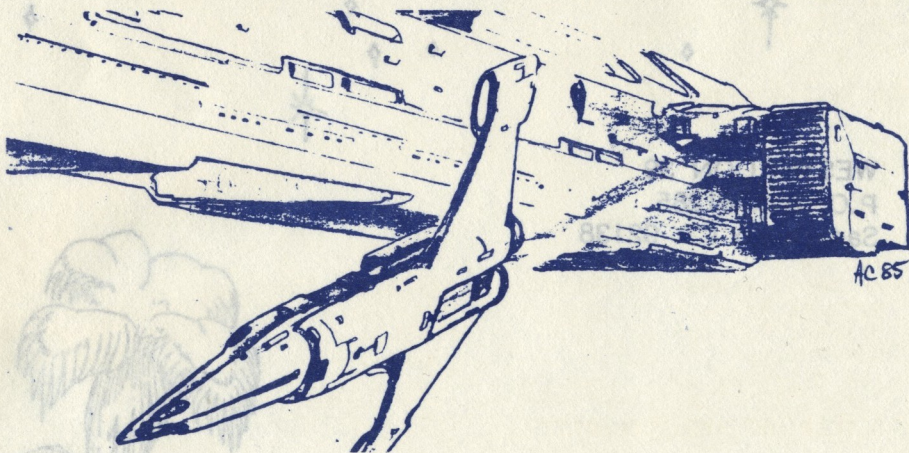
We expect 5,000 to 6,000 to attend our convention, making it just slightly smaller than a WorldCon. The only major difference between our convention and the WorldCon will be that we won't be conducting the Hugo Awards.

We're sending this mailing to almost 10,000 households to give everyone a chance to get in on the low-cost membership rate of \$25.00...we're going to try to keep our rates well below recent Worldcons, but earlier is always cheaper. Because of the large print run, this PR is necessarily brief...PR 2 will contain a lot more about CactusCon.

We have available to us the facilities of two major convention hotels as well as a giant convention center, the Phoenix Civic Plaza. We will be holding our daytime activities primarily at the Civic Plaza (two blocks from the furthest of our four hotels). The Plaza will host the main Program, films, video, Art Show, Dealers' Room, Masquerade, and many other daytime functions. Nighttime activities will be in the hotels.

Our convention will get underway on Thursday, September 3, 1987 by around 10 am with regular registration's opening. Art Show and Dealers' Room will open around 1 pm that day along with light programming. Major convention activities will continue through Sunday, September 6, 1987 with most activities closing down by early evening. We will probably have a few pre-convention activities on the 2nd (early pre-registration and con hospitality suite) and a post-convention party on the 7th (Labor Day).

Let us know what you would like to see at the NASFiC! We're pledging to put on a genuinely world-class convention and have an experienced group to do it...and we welcome you all to join us all in Phoenix in 1987!

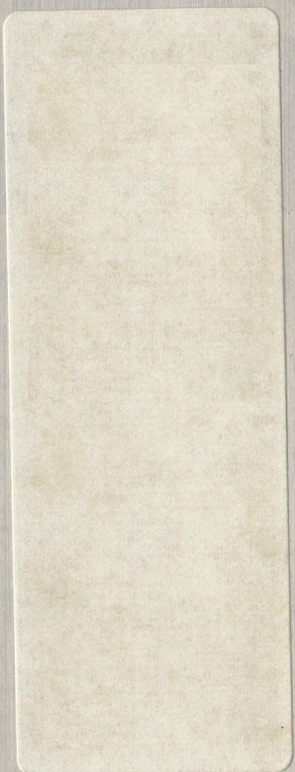
